


As we gathered last Wednesday night for choir practice (which I encourage anyone to join us), we were lead by a devotion that kind of hit home for me. In our new music books "Scripture Hymnal" (which can be purchased off Amazon) the following was read to us which I would like to pass along to you today. In the summer of 1984, I hopped the few fences and walked along a sea wall to our pastures yard where "Brother Bill" taught me how to throw his 12-foot cast net into a canal. I remember his patience as I tangled in that around the skinny 6th grade frame. I remember the taste of salt water and seaweed as a crunched the nylon rope between my teeth, and I remember the measured praise and they hauled into small. But I don't remember any of his sermons. I do however remember every word of "Because he Lives", "Amazing Grace" which we will talk about on February 16th "Victory in Jesus", "Great is thy Faithfulness", "Holy Holy Holy", "How great thou art"," It is Well with my soul", and "Leaning on the everlasting arms". From youth group I remember "Great is the Lord"," He has made me glad", "Seek ye 1st", and the "Father, I adore you". My college Methodist Chapel taught me "Come thou fount of every blessing", "Rock of Ages", and "Be thou my vision", because of my childhood pastor I can toss a cast net in a pretty circle. But I know the gospel because I remember the songs. (Randall Goodgame 2024). There is part of this statement I agree with. Over the years even I don't remember all the sermons I've ever heard, or even all that I have ever written since 1996. I do however remember most of the songs that I have learned most of my life. When I sang my first solo song in grade school at a funeral which was "On Eagles Wings", or my grade school play days when I did church program and was King Melchior "Follow a Star", or in 8th grade and was Kurt Von Trap from The Sound of Music. When I was in College taking Applied voice and my semester test final song was "Music of the Night" from Phantom of the Opera. And then when I finally got to see my first concerts. So many Michael W. Smith, and when I finally got to see Journey a few years ago and heard "Don't Stop Belevin". Church music is important because it helps people connect with God, express their love for God, and unite with the church. Connecting with God Music can help people feel a direct connection with God. Singing can help people express their love for God with their whole being. Music can help people remember their faith. Expressing love for God Music can help people express their love for God through song. Music can help people express their response to God and the church. Uniting with the church Singing together can help people feel a sense of belonging and unity. Music can help people develop a unity of mind and heart. Teaching the gospel Music can help people learn about the gospel of Jesus Christ. Music can help people memorize the gospel. Other benefits Music can help people improve their mood. Music can help people find meaning in their suffering. Music is something we both here and sing when we worship. This is related to the fact that worship is both call and response. The call of God reaches the depths of our hearts with special power through music, and our singing expresses with special power the deepest response of our hearts to God. The music makes a difference in how everything else in the service goes. When we all have been lifted to the heights through music, the pastor and others who lead worship are inspired to preach and lead with greater freedom and power. Those who worship in the pews find their hearts and minds opened to hear more clearly and receive more fully the good news that is the gospel. Blessings Y'all Pastor Brian






Pastor Brian is gone Thursday Feb. 26th from 9-12 for Circuit Meeting in Newton.
