


"Do You Believe This?"

In John 11, Jesus got a notice that Lazarus in Bethany, the brother of Mary and Martha, was dead. So, he went to their house. On his arrival, Jesus found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?" I am just awe-struck by this conversation between Jesus and Martha. Martha had zero understanding of what Jesus meant. She meant her brother's resurrection in the future, but Jesus meant 'raising Lazarus now.' I can picture Martha being astounded that Jesus resurrected her brother right there. He was no longer in the tomb. Does this surprise you?

The question posed by Jesus, "Do you believe this?" resonates deeply with me. It prompts a personal reflection: "Do I truly believe at this moment that Jesus is the resurrection and the life? Do I genuinely believe that I will experience eternal life even after death?" I contemplate how our actions might change if we fully embraced this belief. Philips Brooks articulated, "Let every man and woman consider themselves immortal. Let them grasp the revelation of Jesus through His resurrection. Let them proclaim not just, 'Christ is risen,' but rather, 'I shall rise.'" Embracing this conviction allows us to transform our lives in the present. It enables us to discover new vitality even when circumstances seem devoid of life. Through this belief, we can perceive light illuminating a dark tomb. As Christ dwells within us and alongside us through the Holy Spirit, we are inspired to experience the future in the present. It is through this belief that we can effect change in our lives today.

The Easter Season serves as an opportunity to reflect on the various ways resurrection can manifest in our lives. Jesus did not sacrifice himself on the cross merely for us to lead comfortable and well-adjusted lives. His mission is profoundly more significant: He aims to transform us into His likeness before we are welcomed into heaven. As individuals embodying the spirit of Easter, we are called to rise and effect positive change in this world. Wishing you and your families a JOYOUS EASTER!






